## **VOLUNTEER POLICY**

As an all-volunteer organization, St. louis Animal Rights Team (START) values and relies on its volunteers for all of its activities, events and accomplishments. To further the efforts and effectiveness of START, it is important for you, our volunteers to:

- Support the vision and objectives of START's mission statement
- Make a good faith effort to participate in any activity for which you have signed up. Call START promptly if you will not be able to attend.
- Treat other members with courtesy and respect. Please refrain from domination discussions and listen attentively to others during meetings. Support members' expression of different views, opinions and feelings relative to issues brought up for discussion.
- Please refrain from making or receiving cellular phone calls during meetings.
- Refrain from unsafe, impertinent or discourteous behavior that endangers the health or safety
  of members, draws undesirable attention to START or individual members, or has the potential
  for damaging the reputation of START or individual members in the community or among peer
  groups.
- When participating in a public event, be cognizant that you are representing START. Treat all
  others with courtesy and respect, even if they express opposing views or opinions than those of
  START. Act and dress in a way that will reflect credit upon you and START. Refer media to a
  designated START spokesperson. Obey directions given by START event coordinators.
- Refrain from the use of alcohol or illegal drugs prior to or during any meeting, event, or other
  duty while acting on behalf of START. This does not include the non-abusive use of alcohol prior
  to a social event at which you are acting as an individual and not on behalf of START nor does it
  include the moderate use of alcohol served by START at a START event.
- Pay organizational dues on a yearly basis, preferably in January.
